

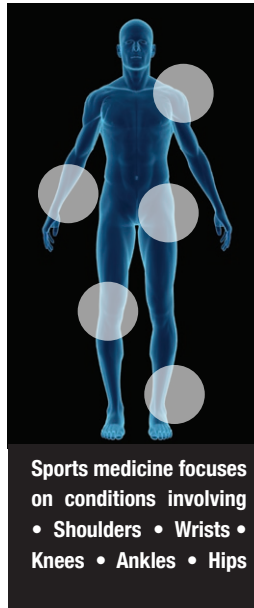

Dr. Thatcher attended Boston University for medical school, with an internship at Dartmouth Hitchcock Medical Center and residency at the University of Massachusetts.

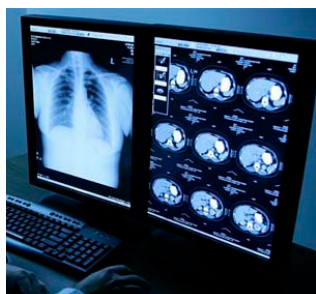


Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation Services
